Daisy Dash Frequently Asked Questions

What is Daisy Dash?

Daisy Dash is a fundraising event supporting [Girl Scouts of Oregon and Southwest Washington](#). This day-long adventure challenge is open to everyone—you don't have to be a Girl Scout to play!

How does Daisy Dash work and how do you play?

Daisy Dash is a team-based game where participants complete up to 100 fun and exciting challenges, take pictures/video and upload them into an app to earn prizes and have fun.

At 10 a.m. on Saturday, September 9, the race will begin virtually! A list of challenges will appear in your app and you will work with your team to complete them. You will pick what challenges you want to complete and how you will achieve them. Then team members will work together to complete the tasks, taking pictures or videos as required (with your official Daisy Dash bandana). As you complete challenges, you will earn points and you'll be able to cheer on fellow players as you look through your newsfeed on the app.

As race day approaches, team captains and participants will receive instructions on how to download a special game app and get prepared for the event. While not everyone on the team needs a mobile device, every team must have access to at least one mobile device on game day to play.

This game is designed to be flexible. You may start your day at home, in a park, your office—anywhere you feel comfortable. Throughout the day, more challenges will be released and you will have total flexibility in how you achieve them. You might stay at home the entire day or venture out into your community. Part of the excitement is not knowing what's in store for you the rest of the day. Creativity is also highly encouraged, so if you have the opportunity to go all out on a challenge, do it!

At certain times during game play, Station Stops may be announced. Station Stops will likely be in the Portland Metro area and Medford, Oregon. Teams are highly encouraged to join the fun and complete the challenges at these locations. Locations will not be announced in advance of game launch and are sure to be super fun and unique.

Towards the end of the day, you may choose to join fellow players at a Finish Line Celebration event. There will be two finish lines in Oregon. One will be at Camp Mountaindale in North Plains, Oregon, and the other will be at the Girl Scouts of Oregon and Southwest Washington's Medford Service Center. You can continue completing challenges at the finish line locations. Special celebrity guests will be leading some final challenges! The cell service and internet is not reliable at Camp Mountaindale and teams completing challenges at Camp Mountaindale will transition to showing their photos and videos to an in-person judge on location at Mountaindale. The finish line locations open at 3 p.m.

Who are the celebrity guests?

Jackie Joyner-Kersey: We're excited to announce that track superstar and one of the most decorated female athletes of all time, Jackie Joyner-Kersey, will be joining us for Daisy Dash! Jackie—a Girl Scout alum!—will be hosting two challenges during Daisy Dash. One challenge will be done remotely so all teams can participate no matter where they are located and the second activity will be done at the finish line at Camp Mountaindale. Winners of the Mountaindale challenge will have the opportunity to take a team picture with her as well. Jackie will also be available for the awards ceremony at Mountaindale, where she will address participants and our most successful Daisy Dash finishers will have the opportunity to take a special finish line photo if they are present.



Linda Carter: In Medford, Daisy Dash participants will have the opportunity to join billiards pro, Linda Carter. Linda has been involved in every facet of billiards at every level for decades! She was one of only 15 women selected to be on the International Pool Tour's roster of over 150 top players in the world, 2005-2006.

Other local celebrity guests will be announced closer to the event date.

Who can participate in Daisy Dash?

Anyone can participate in Daisy Dash!

When is Daisy Dash?

Daisy Dash will take place on Saturday, September 9, 2023, with gameplay from 10 a.m. - 6 p.m. PST. A VIP reception will be held at 5 p.m. for VIP team members and sponsors at our Camp Mountaindale location. A special awards celebration will be held from 6-6:30 p.m. Pacific at both finish lines at Camp Mountaindale and GSOSW's Medford Service Center.

Where does Daisy Dash take place?

Daisy Dash can be played from anywhere in the world! Via a game app, teams can play at home, in their neighborhood and out in their local community. In-person Finish Line Celebration events and an award ceremony will take place in person at GSOSW's Medford Service Center and at Camp Mountaindale in North Plains, Oregon. Additionally, secret "Station Stops" will be announced during game play.

Please note, the game is designed for you to pick and choose which challenges you want to complete. You are welcome to complete the game in one place or to venture throughout your city and region. Where you play is up to you!

How do I register for Daisy Dash?

Registration for Daisy Dash is fast and simple! Choose from several registration options:

- **VIP Team Package - \$1,000/Team**

A special VIP package gives teams the opportunity to support Girl Scouts while having an incredible day of fun at the same time. This VIP team experience includes event participation for up to five team members, a game flag (to include in your photo and video proof), an upgraded SWAG bag for every player, PLUS access to a VIP reception (players 21+ only) at 5 p.m. at Camp Mountaindale where you will get a personal picture with Jackie Joyner-Kersee. VIP teams will also receive extra surprise game benefits throughout the event. No Girl Scout membership is required. [Register for a VIP Team.](#)

- **Community Team Package - \$250/Team**

This is the standard package open to all participants. No Girl Scout membership is required. Includes event participation for up to five team members, a game flag (to include in your photo and video proof!), and a swag bag for each player. [Register for a Community Team.](#)

- **Girl Scout Team Package - \$125/Team**

This discounted option, only available through July 31, 2023, is open to teams with at least one currently registered youth Girl Scout member. Includes event participation for up to five team members, a game flag (to include in your photo and video proof!), and a swag bag for each player. Girl Scouts may use Cookie Program Credits for Daisy Dash registration. This is a great option for Girl Scout families and troops wanting to participate. [Register for a Girl Scout Team.](#)

Registration will close on August 31, so register your team today!

Do I have to have a full team to register?

No! You can register your team today and fill your team at your own pace. You can use our team promotion toolkit to invite friends and family to join your team or even start their own! Please email answers@girlscoutsosw.org for your toolkit.

Does our team have to have five players?

No! Your team can be anywhere from 2-5 players in size. But your Daisy Dash experience will be more fun and successful with a full team of five!

I thought Daisy Dash was 24 hours?

In response to feedback from members and supporters, we've shortened the length of Daisy Dash and simplified game play so more people can play. Daisy Dash is now a one-day event, featuring 100 challenges for teams to complete.

Is Daisy Dash just for Daisies (the Girl Scout level for K-1 graders)?

No! This fundraising event is open to everyone—community members, families, Girl Scouts of all ages and more. Anyone who wants to play is welcome! Daisy Dash is named for Girl Scout founder Juliette Gordon Low, who was affectionately called Daisy by her family and friends. Daisy famously concocted fun and wild ways to support Girl Scouts—at one point even dropping fundraising pamphlets from an airplane!—and it is in this spirit that the fun, wild and exciting Daisy Dash is named for her.

Is Daisy Dash a run?

No, Daisy Dash is not a run. But with just eight hours to complete all 100 challenges, it will be a race to beat the clock!

What do proceeds from Daisy Dash support?

Proceeds support local Girl Scouts in Oregon and SW Washington as they build leadership and life skills, connect with new friends, and improve their communities.

What supplies do I need to play Daisy Dash?

All teams will need a mobile device in order to play the game. Devices are not provided. Beyond that, all of the Daisy Dash challenges are designed to be completed with supplies that you would naturally find in most households. Plus, creativity is encouraged so if you don't have something, improvise! You just might impress the judges and get extra points.

What do I do if I have a question or problem during the event?

What prizes are available?

In addition to the swag bags received at registration, all teams will be awarded challenge prizes at the 20,000 and 50,000 point levels, and for completing all 100 challenges.

- 20,000 Point Level Prize: Daisy Dash Patch
- 50,000 Point Level Prize: Daisy Dash T-Shirt
- 100 Challenges Completed Prize: Lantern Flashlight

Mystery prizes including treats, passes, tickets and experiences to continue the adventure will be awarded throughout the game to teams with exceptional challenge entries, so keep the creativity coming—it just might pay off!

Grand prizes (to be announced closer to the event) will also be awarded to the top three teams based on total points earned.

How do I receive my swag bag?

Beginning at the end of August/early September, teams will have the opportunity to pick up their swag bags at the Girl Scout Service Centers in Portland, Medford, Eugene and Bend. If these locations are not convenient for the team, the swag bag will be mailed. Each member of the team will receive a swag bag.

How do I receive my game bandana?

Beginning at the end of August/early September, teams will have the opportunity to pick up their bandana at the Girl Scout Service Centers in Portland, Medford, Eugene and Bend. If these locations are not convenient for the team, the bandana will be mailed. Each team will receive one bandana.

What if my teams can only participate for part of the day?

We understand that you're busy! Daisy Dash is meant to be fun and flexible, so you get to choose if you want to go all in or just complete a couple of challenges before nap time. Starting on time, going to Station Stops and joining us at our Finish Line Celebration events will help you rack up the points. But if you can't make it to all of them, don't despair. This game will still have plenty for you to experience with your besties.

Will I get to meet Jackie Joyner-Kersey and talk to her or take a photo?

There will be lots of opportunities to connect with Jackie Joyner-Kersey. Unfortunately, due to time constraints and our packed schedule, only VIP teams and challenge winners will be able to get personal photos and interact with our celebrity guest.

- Every VIP team will have the opportunity to attend the VIP Reception (5 p.m. to 5:45 p.m.) at Camp Mountindale for a meet & greet photo opportunity with Jackie Joyner-Kersey.
- All participants will have the opportunity to join a challenge with Jackie Joyner-Kersey during a lunch break Zoom interview from 12 p.m. to 12:30 p.m. The interview will utilize the chat feature and be moderated by a GSOSW Girl Scout.
- Participants are also invited to join the three-legged race challenge led by Jackie Joyner-Kersey at Camp Mountindale. The three-legged race begins at 3:45 p.m. Camp Mountindale will open at 3 p.m. There is limited parking at Camp Mountindale and carpooling with your team is required.

- Jackie Joyner-Kersey will be a presenter and speaker at the 6 p.m. Daisy Dash Finish Line Celebration at Camp Mountaindale. All participants are invited to attend the Finish Line Celebration.

What's the Finish Line Celebration and do I have to attend?

Attendance at the Finish Line Celebrations is optional. These events are a great way to bring the community together and celebrate Daisy Dash! An ice cream social will be part of the finish line events.

The Finish Line Celebrations will be held at 6 p.m. (exactly when the game ends) at Camp Mountaindale and Girl Scouts of Oregon & SW Washington's Medford Service Center. Prizes will be available for pick up at the finish line locations.

Camp Mountaindale has unreliable cell service and internet. Participants are highly encouraged to complete as many challenges as possible before traveling to Camp Mountaindale. On-site judges will be available at Camp Mountaindale to assist teams with receiving points for any challenges that are completed at Camp Mountaindale.

Jackie Joyner-Kersey will be a featured guest speaker at the Camp Mountaindale Finish Line Celebration.

Is the price of my Daisy Dash ticket tax deductible?

Yes. Daisy Dash is a fundraising event for Girl Scouts of Oregon and SW Washington. Every ticket sold supports us as we invest the funds in building girls of courage, confidence, and character, who make the world a better place. \$1,000 VIP tickets are tax deductible minus the value of the reception, which will be reflected on a year end tax receipt that is mailed to the donor.
